## Visit to Teen Challenge

My colleague and long-time missionary friend, Mike Shields, and I visited the Teen Challenge Center in Calera de Tango, a city that lies about an hour and a half south of Santiago, Chile. We were able to spend time with Ivan Reyes, the center's director and the 35 men who were there trying to find a better path for their life through a journey of hope and healing. Hundreds of men who are struggling with life-controlling addictions pass through this Teen Challenge program every year.

These men spend around 9 months in the program with the hope of finding recovery and renewal. Ivan and his Teen Challenge workers wake up every day with a passion to change the world and aspire to provide a platform that not only helps people find freedom through recovery but also helps fill a void that only God can fill.

By rebuilding and restoring purpose, and kindling an eternal hope through a strong relationship with the Lord, their programs are transformational. They are confident that a restored relationship with God, through Jesus Christ, can transform those who suffer from addiction into vibrant, free and sober followers of the Lord.

We continually celebrate the progress of this program, but we cannot go without stating how grateful we are for our supporters who have allowed us to help rehabilitation programs such as Teen Challenge in Calera de Tango. You have

Johnny Pradines is another friend who started as an intern in our ministry. He was recently treated for leukemia. In this picture, I had visited him in the hospital when he was recuperating from chemotheraphy. He has since shared with me that after being there for eight months, he is now in remission. Over the years, I have been able to pour into his life and that of his family. Not just as

an intern or as a friend, but we are fully responsible for and to each other through spiritual development. Please pray with him for continued recovery and healing and financial help to pay for his medical bills.



The interdenominational pastor's group in our area of Santiago gets together once a month. Since most of those attending are young pastors, I was asked to share how to do discipleship through my 50 years of discipleship experience in Chile.
